




Three ways of accessing texts

The third approach allows you to access texts by examining the distribution of word-forms. (=concordances)



# Example 2: Table of contents (Augustine)




The table of contents allows you to access specified passages from individual texts.










### Example 3: distribution of word forms (urbs)







